#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- 1. Rezone request of parcel # 52-08-27-101-062.000-016, aka 401 E. Washington Ave. Peru, IN. 46970, from R1 to R3 for the purpose of converting the single-family home into a duplex.
- ➤ John Madden Jr. spoke briefly stating he intended to make the dwelling a duplex.
  - Sandi Faust asked if everybody had driven by and observed the property, all stated yes.
  - The board asked if it was an existing rental already, John stated yes.
  - The board asked if there was plenty of parking, John stated the whole road was available with at least 3 spots and at the back of the dwelling he could do a huge driveway if needed.

- O Voted in Favor 8-0 ~ Motion Passed to rezone.
- 2. Request to amend the ordinance pertaining bees.
- Sandi stated until now it has been forbidden to have bees, beekeepers, and beehives within the city limits. Changing the ordinance would make it easier for people to raise bees, but a lot of rules and laws need defined. Sandi then read the proposed new ordinance for bee keeping in city limits as below:
  - It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to keep and raise bees within the city limits within 500 feet of any building or other structure where people dwell or reside, work or conduct business unless the owner or beekeeper contains them so that the bees are confined to their own premises; or keeps the bees at an elevation above the surface of the earth which prevents them from alighting and working on and around the dwellings and places of business within the prohibited distance if the bees are not to his property; the owner or keeper of the bees shall keep them at an elevation of not less than 30 feet above the surface of the ground where they are kept, bees kept within the city in violation of this section are declared a nuisance.
  - Conviction of a violation the nuisance shall be abated immediately; if the owner or beekeeper fails
    immediately on conviction to remove the same the police shall have the power and authority and are



directed to abate the nuisance by removing the bees from the city limits at the cost and expense of the owner thereof.

- Discussions opened.
- Tim Simpkins from the audience stated he is the one who brought this up for consideration and the ordinance will need to be changed because the state law changed on this matter in 2019. He stated the state law prevents cities, units, municipalities from being able regulate certain matters of beekeeping and the ordinance being proposed does not follow the law on beekeeping and should not be passed

- **3.** Vacate alley between parcels commonly known as 500 N. Broadway and 20 Albert Street to make a utility easement.

The alley is also overgrown, and the neighbors like to drive through it. The owner of T-Mobile requested the utility easement to help maintain the area. The attorney Dustin Kern



and Peru Utilities had it surveyed for a utility easement so the residence are not maintaining it, it will be recorded tomorrow and then vacated. This resolved the issue with the residence having to maintain it.

- The daughter of the residents of 20 Albert Street stated her concerns of people driving through the area and wanted to know how it could be prevented.
- Sandi Faust stated if they vacate the alley then it will be private property, and her parents and T-Mobile would each have half.
